New Walgreens Proposed for Downtown Northbrook

Developers have plans to construct a new Walgreen's at the intersection of Waukegan and Shermer Roads, replacing Tonelli's Restaurant which has been at the corner for over five decades. Owner Ray Tonelli, who has been unsuccessful in his attempts to sell the business, is working with developers to sell the property as he makes plans for retirement.

"We are excited about bringing this project to Northbrook," comments Michael Nortman, who along with Scott Gendell of Terraco and Mark Carlson of MW Carlson, unveiled their proposal to the Plan Commission last month. The new Walgreen's would be larger than the current store in downtown Northbrook and feature the convenience of a drive-thru pharmacy.

The site plan for the development, which encompasses Tonelli's, six additional lots and an alley, features the 14,408 square foot pharmacy structure, an accessory drive-through consisting of two lanes and a by-pass lane and 56 parking spaces. As an added benefit of the project, developers have included a "gateway feature" which is a monument ground sign with the wording "Village of Northbrook."

Because of its location at one of the Village's busiest corners, traffic flow related to the project has been the topic of much discussion. To ensure safe ingress and egress to the property, developers have restricted right-in/right-out only access off Waukegan Road as well as restricted right-in/right-out only (with the inclusion of a traffic island) access off of Shermer Road and a full access off of Angle Road.

The proposal requires a number of different types of planning and zoning relief including having all property rezoned to C-2 and variances on required setbacks. In addition, the developer has asked for relief as it relates to the signage.

Plan Commissioners were generally receptive to the proposal presented, but asked that further revisions be made to address concerns about traffic and the building set-back requirements. "We are committed to working with the Plan Commission to provide solutions that improve



upon our development plan," commented Nortman.

Neighbors, while generally supportive of the proposal, voiced concerns about the traffic and potential for increased cut-through traffic in their neighborhoods. According to developers, neighbors immediately adjacent to the project have written letters of support and have agreed to work with them on screening and buffer issues.

Both Nortman and Carlson are Northbrook residents and with their partner Gendell have over 75 years of combined experience and have developed over 100 shopping centers. Gendell has successfully developed over 40 Walgreens stores.

The new Walgreens would replace the store in downtown's Northbrook Plaza, located off of Cherry Lane. Developers and village officials are optimistic that the vacancy will present an opportunity for a new destination-type business to relocate within the central business district and will create further opportunities to revitalize the downtown area.

At their next meeting on June 3rd, Plan Commissioners have asked developers to address two issues of concern: traffic flow at the busy intersection, particularly concerns with delivery trucks, and the setbacks on the property, according to Plan Commissioner Sheldon Silverman. He indicated that other issues, including signage, were not controversial and could be

worked out separately. (Before any final approval, all signage would be referred to the Architectural Control Commission for further review.) Earlier this year, Village Trustees were generally supportive of the proposal for the new Walgreens.

The Plan Commission public hearing on the project is scheduled for 7:30 p.m. on June 3 in Village Hall.

Cherry Lane Under Construction



After July 4th, the Village of Northbrook will begin reconstruction of Cherry Lane from Pfingsten to Greenbriar. The construction detour routes westbound traffic on to Walters Avenue. Members should be aware that the area will be more congested when making plans to attend a Chamber networking function. The project is expected to be completed by early Fall.

The reconstruction of Cherry Lane is part of \$20 million dollar infrastructure improvement initiative by the Village that began last year with the reconstruction of Western Avenue, of most roads in Sky Harbor Industrial Park and sidewalk installation. It also includes traffic signal construction and storm water management projects.
