Outdoor Dining License Required for Restaurants

After consulting with representatives of Northbrook's restaurant community, and taking into consideration recommendations made by the Plan Commission, Northbrook Village Trustees voted recently to amend Northbrook's outdoor dining ordinance, establishing a uniform system that eliminates the need for a special permit, converting to a simpler, less costly licensing process.

Under the terms of the new ordinance, the majority of applications for outdoor dining will be approved by the Village Manager, who will have oversight over restaurants located in shopping centers more than 50,000 square feet in gross floor area, restaurants located in the Village Green Overlay District (includes the downtown area) and any restaurant with a previously approved outdoor dining area. All other outdoor seating areas will need approval from the Village Board.

Instead of the current system which not only requires a special permit for many restaurants, accompanied by fees of up to \$2,250, the new ordinance sets an initial application fee of \$50 and eliminates all fees with subsequent renewals. With approval of this new ordinance, all restaurants that want to operate outdoor dining facilities this summer and beyond are required to complete a simple license application, which provides an explanation of their service, including the number of tables, seats, furnishings and other details.

In addition, the Board voted not to

require additional off-street parking, and not to require additional restroom facilities for restaurants offering outdoor dining unless complaints or problems associated with the outdoor dining area are reported. In those cases additional Village Board oversight to regulate parking is allowed.

Restaurant owners welcome the new changes which they feel will encourage more outdoor dining options in Northbrook. "This is a big improvement as more and more restaurants want to satisfy their guests' demands for outdoor dining," according to Renaissance Chicago North Shore Hotel General Manager Ed Buckley. "This new ordinance shows that Northbrook is ahead of the game, providing reasonable oversight, without placing an undue burden on the restaurants."

"Outdoor dining eases up the conges-

tion in the restaurants in the summer months and makes a huge difference in terms of waiting times," according to P.F. Chang's manager Sean Kenny. "I am glad that restaurants had a chance to voice their concerns and that the Village listened to us and came up with this compromise."

Many of the recommendations that helped encourage a change in the current system, were drawn from a meeting facilitated by the Chamber last fall to help Northbrook Village staff gather feedback from nearly a dozen Northbrook restaurant owners and managers.

Village To Install Signage for Business Park

To signify the economic importance of the Sky Harbor Business Park and to help visitors locate companies within the Park, the Village will erect signage at three key entry points into the Park in May.

The signs will be placed near the intersections of Maria Drive and Pflingsten Road on the west, Commercial Avenue and Sanders Road on the northwest and Dundee and Landwehr Roads on the south. The Village's Industrial and Commercial Development Commission (ICDC) provided input to Village staff, who then commissioned graphic designer and Chamber member Iris Marreck, Iris B Communications, to create a design that defines the Park.

The three foot by six foot signs match the colors green and gold used in entry way signs to the Village. A compass symbol is incorporated into the design of the sign to symbolize travel and direction in order to tie the name of the business park back to the area's original use, an airport called Sky

Harbor.

Sky Harbor businesses see the new signs as a welcome addition. ICDC member and Sky Harbor business owner Pat Lederer, Korman Lederer and Associates comments "The signs are a great feature that should really help give the park an identity. They are a nice gesture on the part of the Village which illustrates that they care about the businesses there."

Others believe the signs will help create a cohesive feeling in the park. "The signs will be particularly

helpful to some of the smaller businesses," according to Mehdi Alister, Alphagraphics. "They will not only provide a good corporate identity for the Park, but should help the businesses bond together and begin to regard each other as neighbors."

The signage project caps the Village's recently completed infrastructure project to improve the major roads in the Sky Harbor Park.



Frum Elected to Top Village Post

Longtime Village Trustee Sandy Frum emerged victorious in the April 7 Northbrook Village presidential election, a hotly contested race that pitted Frum against incumbent Eugene Marks and former Village President Mark Damisch.
